COVID-19 RESEARCH

Disparities in health reflect a history of inequity. Louisiana Healthcare Connections partnered with the National Minority Quality Forum in a national research study conducted by their parent company, Centene, in order to assess the impact of COVID-19 on racial minorities and underserved communities. Free testing was given to 1,176 participants with 1,018 enrolled in the study.

We are engaged. Events in 2020 tragically underscored and, once again, brought to the forefront what many know and live every day: systemic racism and inequality plagues our country. Through our ongoing commitment to diversity, social parity and health equity, Louisiana Healthcare Connections brings both perspective and resources to both the moment and the movement.

Urban League of Louisiana (ULLA)

Dedicated to addressing the ongoing racial and social inequities that prevent us all from moving forward, Louisiana Healthcare Connections has, to date, provided ULLA with \$885,000 in support. In addition, we helped drive them in their transition to a statewide organization—providing vision, encouragement, and resources to their growth. Because ULLA fights for justice and empowerment, we will continue to partner with them and amplify their mission to assist and guide the underserved communities in securing economic self-reliance, parity, power, and civil rights.

Southern University and A&M College

A member-school of the Thurgood Marshall College Fund and the flagship institution of the Southern University System, Southern University and A&M College is the largest historically black college in Louisiana. They are also a treasured institution in our state and in the country. Louisiana Healthcare Connections has provided \$155,000 in sponsorships and support. And as a top-ten ranked nursing school in Louisiana, Southern University and A&M has provided Louisiana Healthcare Connections with almost 15% of our exceptional on-staff nurses.

Young Leaders Academy of Baton Rouge

My Voice Matters—Speak Out About Social Justice

Louisiana Healthcare Connections is proud of our ongoing support of an organization dedicated to empowering young African American men with leadership skills and positive self-esteem. Since 2013, we have granted Young Leaders Academy of Baton Rouge \$90,000. In 2020, that included serving as the presenting sponsor of a year-long, statewide initiative to engage youths in ongoing conversations about social justice and racial equality. Hosted by CLEO Legally Inspired College Kohorts of Students (CLICKS), the 2020 program featured a series of virtual town halls with student leaders from across the United States in an interactive discussion of contemporary social issues affecting young people today. The Louisiana program met its maximum enrollment of 30 students and plans to expand to 50 in 2021.
