#4 Louisiana ranks *fourth* in the U.S. for HIV case rates¹
(19.0 per 100,000 population)

HIV screening is a critical tool for reducing transmission and maintaining health.

HOW BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROVIDERS CAN HELP

- Encourage routine preventive care and recommended screenings as part of whole-person wellness
- Facilitate sensitive conversations about sexual health and substance use
- Guide individuals to speak with their primary care provider about HIV screening
- Share available member incentives and support resources to reduce barriers to care

THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROMOTES HIV SCREENING



Once Per Lifetime for Everyone Ages 13 to 64

HIV screening for everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 at least once in their lifetime



During Pregnancy

HIV screening for all pregnant persons, including those who present in labor or at delivery whose HIV status is unknown



At Least Annually for People with Higher Risk of Transmission

Annual HIV screening for people who engage in risk behaviors, including sharing needles, syringes, or other drug injection equipment, and unprotected anal or vaginal sex
